The Nexus LAB (Leading Across Borders) is an Educopia-led project which aims to build community and resources for those who provide leadership training to staff of museums, archives, and libraries. In 2016, the Nexus LAB, in partnership with Toolkit Consulting, developed a fully adaptable and customizable set of seven leadership-focused curriculum modules. These modules were developed for trainers and workshop leaders to use at no charge when delivering field-level leadership development skills. The modules were designed to stand alone, but they can also be delivered in conjunction with one another and/or incorporated alongside other curriculum. While each of the modules focuses on a different topic, they are designed to complement and reinforce one another.
